

LaNA International Participation Fee and Capacity-Building Modules

IEA's Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (LaNA) is a new international assessment of mathematics and reading comprehension skills at the end of primary school. Grounded in and linked to IEA's globally recognized TIMSS and PIRLS, LaNA reports student proficiency across multiple international benchmarks and enables countries to monitor their progress toward SDG Indicator 4.1.1b.

Core International Participation Fee

The core international participation fee for LaNA is US\$185,000 per country.

If more than one country participates in LaNA on the same assessment schedule (with the main data collection not differing by more than two months), the participation fee will be reduced to US\$150,000 per country.

The core fee includes:

- Training and hands-on practice in assessment implementation (sampling, standardized data collection and operations, data management)
- Internationally developed assessment and questionnaires
- Centralized translation of instruments
- Support with sample selection and preparation
- Software, manuals, and training required to implement assessment operations
- Data processing, weighting, and psychometric analyses
- An open-access database, with supporting technical documentation and analysis software
- A results report including:
 - Percentages of students reaching LaNA/TIMSS/PIRLS international benchmarks
 - Data to support SDG Indicator 4.1.1b
 - Contextual variables and relationship to achievement

Payment Distribution

Installment/Year	Percentage	Amount (US\$)
1 st installment (year 1)	60%	\$111,000
2 nd installment (year 2)	40%	\$74,000

Upon signing the participation agreement contract, the invoice will be issued.

In addition to the core international participation fee, participating countries are required to cover national costs associated with implementing LaNA.

Additional LaNA Capacity-Building Modules

In addition to the knowledge transfer, training, and technical support provided under the core international participation fee, countries can choose additional, optional capacity-building modules. These modules offer tailored support for deeper engagement in assessment program management, research design, analysis, and policy use.

Capacity-Building Modules	Fee (US\$)
1) Project Initialization and Management <i>Provides hands-on support to initiate and equip national teams with practical guidance and tools to effectively manage a large-scale assessment. Recommended for countries without experience implementing a cross-national assessment.</i> - Two-day on-site project initialization workshop - Guidance on setting up project management structures - Ongoing targeted support during key implementation stages	\$40,000
2) National Questionnaire Development <i>Provides support to strengthen national contextual data collection through customized background questionnaire items.</i> - Workshop and guidance on developing country-relevant research questions and enhancing the international LaNA questionnaires - Analysis of national pilot data to refine instruments for main data collection	\$30,000
3) Secondary Analysis with LaNA Data <i>On-site workshop to equip national teams with practical skills for analyzing LaNA data.</i> - LaNA sampling and survey design - Hands-on training in using the IEA IDB Analyzer for LaNA data analysis and reporting	\$20,000

4) Policy Brief Development <i>Online training and support in the development of a concise, targeted document to communicate key findings and policy implications from LaNA.</i> • Define objectives, audiences, and a communication strategy • Conduct analyses and interpret results for policy use • Develop key messages and draft and finalize brief	\$22,000
